ANZGOG'S EDEN Initiative is leading the charge to reduce the number of new endometrial cancer cases across Australia and New Zealand and improve the lived experiences of women diagnosed with the disease.

Bringing together expert endometrial cancer doctors, nurses and allied health professionals, in combination with passionate researchers and - most importantly - women with a lived experience, to focus on prevention, early diagnosis and better treatment options that are more specific to patient needs.



SURVIVORS TEACHING STUDENTS

Survivors Teaching Students® (STS) is a groundbreaking volunteer program that brings gynaecological cancer survivors and caregivers into the classrooms of emerging health professional students to teach them about women's experiences with the diseases.

The program provides a critical opportunity to teach future health professionals about the importance of detecting and diagnosing ovarian and other gynaecological cancers without delay.

SOLACE2

In the SOLACE2 trial, Professor Clare Scott AM is exploring ways to engage a woman's own immune system to delay the recurrence of their ovarian cancer.

Through molecular profiling,
Professor Scott's focus is to identify
the specific genes driving a woman's
cancer cells and determines how to
switch them off. By finding specific
biomarkers, she aims to personalise
treatment, thereby ensuring the
most effective and targeted therapies
for each patient.
