## CERVICAL CANCER SYMPTOMS

Changes to cervical cells do not usually cause any symptoms. This is why regular Cervical Screening Tests are so important (recommended every 5 years). If cervical cell changes develop into cervical cancer, the most common symptoms include:

Menstrual irregularities such as bleeding between periods, longer and heavier periods, and bleeding after menopause



Unusual vaginal discharge



Excessive tiredness or fatigue



Bleeding and pain during/after sexual intercourse



Leg pain or swelling



Lower back pain
