VAGINAL CANCER SYMPTOMS

Vaginal cancer often doesn't cause early symptoms, but may be found during a Cervical Screening Test. Below are some of the key symptoms that might indicate vaginal cancer. It's critical that women consult a doctor if they experience any of these symptoms.

Appearance of a lump in the vagina

Frequent urge to urinate or blood in urine

Vaginal bleeding after intercourse

Pain and discomfort in the pelvic area



Bloody vaginal discharge (unrelated to menstruation)
